


Executive summary

✓ Mobile check-ins:

Once compliance is verified, contractors can access key cabinets or restricted areas without needing someone to manually hand over credentials. Instead of compliance being a slow and manual hurdle, it becomes a fast, seamless part of the workflow. Everyone knows what is expected, everyone is protected, and the work gets started sooner.

Today, schools, councils, aged care homes, and small businesses are making the shift because the benefits are real, and achievable, without needing a full IT department.

Smart compliance: why digitising makes you safer, not just faster

• Clearer expectations: No last-minute surprises or


No last-minute surprises or paperwork missing on the day.
